Ames/Reche Groundwater Storage and Recovery Project



Recharge Capacity is 1,500 Acre Feet Per Year. An Acre Foot Would Cover a Football Field One-Foot Deep.

The recharge facility receives water from outside the Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency service area so it is a secondary supply necessary to balance our water resources for long-term sustainability. This water comes from the State Water Project (SWP). Water from the SWP travels over 700 miles from northern California and the Sacramento Delta through a series of canals,

pipelines and pump stations to the Mojave Water Agency in Apple Valley who then pushes the water through the Morongo Basin Pipeline approved by voters in the early 1990's. The construction of the Ames/Reche Groundwater Storage and Recovery Project fulfills this decades old vision to bring a secondary source of water to augment groundwater supply increasing overall reliability of our water supply.
